The collection includes ceramics, furniture, glass, horology (clocks and watches), metalwork (including silver), paintings (including miniatures and engravings), textiles, and objets d'art predominantly of English 18th century origin, as well as items from Europe, India, China and Japan. The Collection is constantly improving and adding to the public information through research and scholarship, with updates being made to records on a regular basis and images added to the TJC website when they become available. Meet at Pullman Melbourne on the Park, 192 Wellington Parade, East Melbourne at 9.45am. A courtesy bus will take visitors to the Collection venue, Fairhall House, for the tour. 	On Wednesday 28 April meet at the Mornington Golf Course Visitor Parking Area at 9:45am where we will be met by a bus that will transport us to the property nearby. At the conclusion of the afternoon tour we will be returned to the carpark. (at about 2:30-3:00pm)The entrance fee of \$40 covers the cost of Morning Tea and Lunch together with tours of the house and garden. Beleura House, an Italianate villa, was designed by Joseph Reed in 1863. Throughout the years up until 1916, this house was bought and sold numerous times and occupied by some notable owners who used it generally as a summer retreat. The next owners, Sir George and Lady Tallis expanded the size of the property to make it a viable farming				

	property whilst continuing to use Beleura as a seaside house. When Sir George Tallis died it was acquired by the youngest son John who eventually bequeathed Beleura and its contents to the people of Victoria in 1996.

	<p>Mary Quant - Fashion Revolutionary - a retrospective exhibition on the iconic British fashion designer Dame Mary Quant. Bendigo is the exclusive Australian venue for this exhibition from the Victoria and Albert Museum. The exhibition explores the years between 1955 and 1975 when Mary Quant revolutionised the high street, harnessing the youthful spirit of the swinging sixties and the new mass production techniques to create a new look for women. Quant was a powerful role model for the working woman. Challenging conventions, she popularised the miniskirt, colourful tights and tailored trousers - encouraging a new age of feminism.</p> <p>Tickets for this exhibition are selling fast. U3A Banyule has made a commitment to purchase 19 tickets for members. This commitment must be met by 9 April. It might be possible to obtain more tickets if there is a high demand from members.</p>
